The Releaguing Plan was approved by the Orange County Area who followed their processes.

Daniel Moyer, Principal at Crean Lutheran High School presented their case using the PowerPoint presentation that appears at the end of these minutes. Paul Lopez then reviewed the procedures used during the Orange County releaguing process throughout the spring. There were multiple meetings held during the process where the Athletic Directors and Principals in the Orange County area shared thoughts, ideas, and potential proposals with each other. Mr. Lopez characterized the conversations during these meetings as being meaningful and honest. The final proposal approved by the Orange County area passed with a vote of 42-37.

Principal Moyer took time during his rebuttal to state that the competitive equity element as per the Blue Book Bylaw 32.C, was not followed in the process. There was clarifying discussion regarding the procedures of schools changing leagues during the caucus time following the final vote, which was extended to accommodate these possible movements.

There was a motion and a second to support the appeal of Crean Lutheran. The motion failed 5-10-2.

The Releaguing Plan was approved by the Orange County Area who followed their processes.

Dr. Jason Allemann, Principal at Laguna Beach High School presented their case using the PowerPoint presentation that appears at the end of these minutes. Paul Lopez then reviewed the procedures used during the Orange County releaguing process throughout the spring. There were multiple meetings held during the process where the Athletic Directors and Principals in the Orange County area shared thoughts, ideas, and potential proposals with each other. Mr. Lopez characterized the conversations during these meetings as being meaningful and honest. The final proposal approved by the Orange County area passed with a vote of 42-37.

During the caucus time following the final vote to approve the winning proposal, Laguna Beach High School asked to be released from the Century Conference and be moved to the Coast View league. Although the Coast View unanimously accepted Laguna Beach, the Century Conference would not agree to release Laguna Beach stating they would lose a playoff spot if Laguna Beach were to move. Geography was also discussed as Laguna Beach is one of the most southern of the Orange County member schools and the members of their conference are in the northern most area of Orange County.

There was a motion and a second to support the appeal of Laguna Beach. The motion carried unanimously 18-0-0.

Amy Roberts, Principal at St. Margaret's High School presented their case referencing materials that appear in the meeting agenda. Paul Lopez then reviewed the procedures used during the Orange County releaguing process throughout the spring. There were multiple meetings held during the process where the Athletic Directors and Principals in the Orange County area shared thoughts, ideas, and potential proposals with each other. Mr. Lopez characterized the conversations during these meetings as being meaningful and honest. The final proposal approved by the Orange County area passed with a vote of 42-37.

St. Margaret's did not ask for relief from the Golden Empire Conference nor to be moved to the Trinity Conference. The primary concern is that in a conference, there is not a Blue Book guarantee that two leagues must exist in every sport within a conference. If this were to happen, St. Margaret's could not compete with the top-level Trinity League teams. Their school is limited to only 1234 total student population by local ordinances, of which 463 are high school students and of that, 83% of the high school population participates.

There was a motion and a second to support the appeal of St. Margaret's. The motion carried 10-8-0.

Chief Financial Officer, Mitch Carty distributed handouts regarding the 2024-25 school year to the committee and highlighted various items. The handouts appear at the end of these minutes. Activities Directors Representative, Cari Strange spoke regarding the Activities Directors Committee being in support of a proposal of revenue splits coming from gross ticket sales for the revenue sports rather than from net sales. This would relieve the schools the need to report expenses and for them to receive their playoff splits more quickly.

Assistant Commissioner Thom Simmons reviewed the renewing of the Spectrum contract which has replaced Fan Dual, signing them to a three-year deal. They also renewed the contract for the production of the Southern Section This Week TV show. The Southern Section has returned TV/Streaming money to school in the amount of \$206,000 from various media rights agreements. We are in the process of negotiating an extended contract with the NFHS Network.

Superintendent Representative Dr. Reggie Thompkins discussed the workshop he attended regarding mental wellness and that we all deal with this whether directly ourselves or helping those around us and at all levels, not just our students.

President Elect Dr. Alexis Barile was excited to report from her very first national conference. It was cool to be around people with the same mindset, working to create memories for kids and shaping people. Her biggest highlight was keynote speaker, Inky Johnson who spoke on mental health.

Past President Jim Perry attended the baseball rules meeting and electronic communications was a big topic. Looking at video reply but the Football rules committee feels there should be no coach to player technology and no video technology to players during play. The biggest topics seemed to be knee pad coverings and NIL. Less than 1% of high school athletes have NIL deals.

President Dr. Paula Hart Rodas attend the sessions on mental health. She reiterated the message of understanding your own struggle with mental health and the need to retreat for self-help. There is a toolkit available for those in high pressure positions to take care of themselves. Across the nation there are conversations to stop making high school athletics political and to let the kids play sports as it relates to transgender from other states.

He informed the Committee regarding a lawsuit from USA served to the Section Office but should have been served at the CIF State regarding the transgender issue. The US Supreme court will hear the transgender athletes case during their October session and a ruling will follow. Lastly, he read a letter he received regarding Rob Dearborn, Track and Field Divisional and Masters Meet director, going above and beyond the call of duty to find a lost cell phone for a student athlete.
